- To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.
- To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.
- To promote the adoption and the application of high social, business, and professional standards.
- To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship.
- To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.
- To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and goodwill.

In the next several newsletters, I'll list ways that Kiwanis International encourages clubs to promote the Objects. In order to "give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life", we are encouraged to participate in the EliMiNaTe Project.

With the EliMiNaTe Project, KI and UNICEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus (MNT). This deadly disease steals the lives of nearly 60,000 innocent babies and a significant number of women each year. The effects of the disease are excruciating – tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch. Every 10 minutes, someone around the world dies from tetanus. But we're making an impact....the World Health Organization recently confirmed that three countries – China, East Timor and Tanzania – have eliminated MNT!

I wish you and your family a blessed holiday season. Thank you for all that you do for our club and our community!




