Dear Fellow Kiwanians,

December was certainly filled with opportunities to put into practice our 2011-2012 Club Slogan "We make a living by what we get; we make a life by what we give." Each week we gave of our time and financial resources starting off the month with our collection of \$972 for the Boots & Coats program followed by our annual Kids Shopping Spree at Target with 24 members (and family members) participating to give 22 children a \$50 Christmas shopping spree. Then on Thursday December 8th we collected 250 plus cans and boxes of food for the Salvation Army food drive plus took up a collection for our servers of \$575. And on Friday, December 16th 45 members rang the Salvation Army Bell for 55 hours to collect \$4,315.69 for this great program. If that's not enough giving, 48 members (including 4 new members plus 16 non-members) gave 522 hours to staff the photo positions (including Santa) for our Santa project from Novmeber 19 through December 24 (we were still taking photo's at 4:10 on Christmas Eve).

Plus somehow we found time to induct six new members during the month, which reminds me to remind you, of the importance of inviting prospects to our meetings. If you recall, I reported previously that only 11% of our members invited a prospect last year while we converted 62% of those prospects to members. So if we can just improve our # of prospects invited to our meetings, membership growth will take care of itself. Please invite your neighbors, coworkers, vendors, customers, etc and don't forget your prospective member's meal cost is paid by the club.

After School Program

Roughly two years ago, we decided to pursue a large community project. A committee of Kiwanians was formed to pursue a Boy's and Girl's Club, but after researching the idea it was determined we could not commit to the financial needs of the project. Another idea gave way and the After School Program was born. Grant money, a determined principal, Gene Cleland, and a caring teacher, Jackie Swink, made the After School Program at Aldo Leopold Middle School a success. By spring, James Madison was on board, lead by another tremendous teacher, Jenny Mehaffy. Kiwanis assisted by providing funds to ensure the students had healthy snacks and reward trips throughout the spring.

As the result of the program and a lot of hard work, the students showed a huge improvement. Grades at James Madison improved by 10% in Math, 14% in Science, 11% in Social Studies, and 10% in Literature last year. Several students showed even more amazing results, one increased his Math grade 37% from an F at 53% to an A at 90% and another student increased from 48% to 84% in Social Studies. In the future, we plan to track attendance, disciplinary infractions, and standardized test scores, in addition to academic grades.

As with several government sponsored programs, budget cuts at the federal and state levels, resulted in the loss of the grant, and the end of the After School Programs. Our committee has worked hard to come up with a quality program on a tight budget. The Burlington School District is working with us and providing facilities including all utilities. We have found ways to limit the costs of snacks and transportation to reduce our overall expenses. We have also reduced the number of days a week for the program from 4 to 3. The result of collaboration and hard work by the committee is a reduction of the total cost to about \$9,000 for the second semester (16 weeks) at each school. This funding will pay for 3 teachers to lead each day, snacks for the students, and a ride home. To fully fund the program at Aldo Leopold Middle School, we have a pledge of \$1,000 from the Burlington Education Foundation and up to \$8,000 from Kiwanis. We are currently working with other service groups and organizations to acquire resources to provide an After School Program at James Madison, and eventually at West Burlington.

Funding, however, is only part of the need. Vital to the success of the program are the volunteers that make a difference in the lives of the children. Every day, the program will consist of three separate sessions, one part of the day will be academic, another session will be a program where students learn life skills, and there will be time for a snack and physical activity. The program will begin February 14 and run Tuesday - Thursday from 3-5. Volunteers are needed to help the teachers. The success of the program relies on adult role models to encourage the students to work hard and, even more importantly, just be there to care for them. These students do not go home to someone who asks how their day was, they do not have someone who tells them "Way to go," or to someone who finds education important.

There were several letters to Santa including one with pasted color pictures of the requested toys, but most were verbal requests. We also had one child whose only request was that mommy and daddy would get back together. The expressions that we see and the interactions with the children each year are to be cherished and they are why most of us enjoy working on this project.

We have not finalized the totals yet and we are still due some proceeds from the Pzazz employees party. The committee has already discussed some issues and we plan on addressing some key points that we feel we can improve upon. We know that we deliver a good product at a good price, we just need more exposure without a high cost attached to it.
