Dear Fellow Kiwanians,

Seeing the pictures of the newest addition to the royal family has made me think of all the parents around the world that can't hold their newborns for various reasons. And it makes me proud that Kiwanis International has chosen to try to eliminate one of those very reasons.

If you were at our club meeting several months ago when the Illinois-Eastern Iowa District Governor and Past District Governor presented on the EliMiNate Project, you know what I am talking about. The EliMiNate Project is the effort by Kiwanis International to eliminate Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus (MNT).

What is MNT?

In 28 countries around the world, MNT can quickly turn the joy of childbirth into tragedy. MNT kills one baby every nine minutes. Can you imagine not being able to hold your infant child? Mothers of children with neonatal tetanus are not able to because their tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch. Tetanus kills mothers, too.

Who suffers from MNT?

MNT is caused when tetanus spores, found in soil everywhere, come into contact with open cuts during childbirth. The disease strikes the poorest of the poor...the geographically hard to reach and those without health care.

Can MNT be stopped?

Yes! MNT is highly preventable. Just three doses of a 60-cent immunization protect mothers, who then pass on the immunity to their future babies. Together, Kiwanis and UNICEF can stop this disease. There are 28 countries in Africa, Asia, Europe and North America that MNT is still taking lives.

What can I do?

There are many worthwhile projects going on around the world through various churches and nonprofit organizations; sometimes its hard to decide which is the most beneficial or the most organized or the most needed. I encourage you to learn more about the Eliminate Project at www.kiwanis.org.
