Continuing with our theme of the Six Objects of Kiwanis International, here is the Third Object: "To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business and professional standards." This could include working with our Key Club or local Scouts group on a project to protect the environment. Do you have a green thumb, or at least a desire to help make our community look better? If so, please be on the look-out for a service project in the near future to do just this work.

One way to promote higher standards in business is to donate to the Kiwanis International Foundation which helps support local Kiwanis Clubs with grants in times of natural disasters and the EliMiNaTe program, aimed at eliminating maternal and neonatal tetanus in developing countries.

Another idea is to donate to the Illinois-Eastern Iowa District Foundation, which is the Spastic Paralysis Research Foundation. Spastic Paralysis is not necessarily a disease itself, but a symptom of various diseases or medical conditions of the central nervous system that cause stiff or rigid muscles that interfere with walking, movement or speech. Research done by the Foundation has included diseases such as brain tumors, Spina Bifida, and Alzheimer's. Also included is analysis on the genetic causes of mental retardation such as Fragile X Syndrome, fetal alcohol syndrome, stroke rehabilitation, neonatal care and developmental disabilities of prematurely born infants.

The Shamrock Shuffle is a fund raiser organized by the 2013 class of Greater Burlington Leadership. Proceeds from the event will be donated to middle school after school programs which currently have a high demand but can only afford to assist 60 at-risk youth. The after school program is a service project of Burlington Kiwanis and supported by volunteers to provide the kids additional educational assistance, a safe place to be, and nutritious snacks from 3 to 5 PM, Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays at Aldo Leopold and Edward Stone Middle Schools in Burlington.

In October, Kiwanis member Jerry Parks presented on the after school program to Greater Burlington Leadership during their education session. The class was in unanimous agreement that the proceeds from their group project needed to benefit the After School Program.

In February, members of the class presented the idea at a regular club meeting when the program was on the After School Program. Students along with teachers from both middle schools also presented that day. The groups goal is to receive business sponsorships to pay for all expenses and have all of the registration fees benefit the after school programs.

The Shamrock Shuffle is a 5 K run/walk where participants will run or walk through bursts of color along the festive course.
