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

Club Financial Review

A BIG thank you to Christine Stensland, John Bentler and Bob Prall! These three individuals poured over the financial records of both the Activities Corporation and the Club Account. To our knowledge, our club accounts have never had an audit or financial review. If you would like copy of their full report, please let either myself or one of them know. Volunteers are needed to give out tickets for Santa Pictures and Spin Art at the gate beginning at 5:30 p.m., collect donated food items, and to work at the prize table. Please contact Dara Henneke or Lois Blythe if you can help in any way.



Here is the conclusion of their review:

The financial records of both Boards are well documented. Financial reports tie to the bank statements and investments. Findings were minor and immaterial, but there is ample opportunity for financial misconduct outside of the office of Treasurer. The most risk of misappropriation occurs prior to the handling of funds by the Treasurer. We have identified some internal control weaknesses that are beyond the control of the Treasurer. Several recommendations

P a n c a k e Ticket Sales

Ticket Revenue = \$23,974. This is a 3% increase from last year.

Our Non-member sales (Sales Outlets and Ticket Partners) were 878, which was a 25% decrease from last year.

Our members sold 2,213 tickets which was a 5% decrease from last year.

The total advance sales of 2,577 tickets was down 8% from last year.

At Door sales of 514 was a 26% decrease from 2012. The weather certainly did not help our at door sales, nor the numbers served (2,614 from 3,133, a 17% decline).

could strengthen internal control. Several recommendations have been made to provide better protection for the Treasurer. In the end, the Boards will need to decide the exposure risk and determine if changes, especially in the handling of cash, are warranted.

The boards of the Club and the Activities Corp will meet on July 2 and try to correct the recommendations that were addressed in the review. Thanks again to everyone involved in the process of making our club's financial procedures even better.
