Do you know that Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus kills nearly 60,000 babies and a significant number of women each year?

With The Eliminate Project, Kiwanis International and UNI-CEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus. The effects of the disease are excruciating — tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch.

To eliminate MNT from the Earth, more than 100 million mothers and their future babies must be immunized. This requires vaccines, syringes, safe storage, transportation, thousands of skilled staff and more. It will take US\$110 million — and the dedicated work of UNICEF and every member of the Kiwanis family.
