The Coats for Kids project is 25 years old this year. Started in 1991 we have been providing New Coats for children sizes from newborn to 5 years old. Over the 25 years we have given away well over 2,000 coats.

On December 8th at our Kiwanis noon meeting we will be doing our annual member donation collection for Coats for Kids. You all have been very generous over the years for this project. If you fail to bring any cash or a check we will have IOU's for you to fill out. As in the past, Sarah Schwartz is heading up our corporate grant / donation portion of the project. Last year we received funding from Winegard, ShopKo, Burlington Baseball Assoc., and Dave & Cindy Vavroch memorial.

This year we have already distributed 76 coats to The Nest and to Head Start/Early Head Start program. It has been a warm fall and the parents may not have been thinking about a winter coat.
