

Board of Directors Update

Your Directors and Officers met and discussed several items in March including the following funding requests:

- \$5,000 to the Homestead 1839 for their organic, educational farm youth programing which includes school field trips, summer lunch program, seed to canning classes in the barn, pre-school education, a 4 credit program for the ALT School, and special needs children's programs
- \$275 as a Little League team sponsor which strives to develop traits of character, courage, and loyalty while teaching discipline, teamwork and physical wellness in a safe and fun environment
- \$250 to Beaster Bunny 5-K as a race sponsor, which includes race website logo and link, public recognition, logo and name on race t-shirts, on-site signage, race packet inserts,

- and an opportunity to set up a display table for merchandise
- \$250 to Burlington Youth Triathlon to be a bike sponsor. This level's opportunities include: race website logo and link, public recognition, logo and name on race t-shirts, on-site signage, race packet inserts, and an opportunity to set up a display table for merchandise
- \$3,000.00 to the Mississippi Valley Council Boy Scouts of America for financial support in the form of camper sponsorship for grades kindergarten to age 18 years old
- \$300.00 to Mary Wienand for 3 Financial Literacy Children's Books kiosks around the community. These will hold children's books on financial literacy and will include reading guides for parents. The major target age would be 7-11 years old. The Kiwanis name would be prominent on all of the kiosks
