Board of Directors Update

Your Directors and Officers approved the following funding requests at the October board meetings.

Aid to the Needy, which is known as the Nurses Program, where school nurses can purchase necessary items for children in need, \$414.68.

After School Tutoring, \$1,000. In its third year, this allows 9-12th grade students to work on projects, homework, tests, or receive extra help in the classes. The funds will be used to buy bus tokens and provide daily snacks.

Camp Courageous, \$1,000, provides yearround respite care for individuals with special needs. They serve 9,000 campers and families annually. Kiwanis will be named on a special recognition plaque.

Coats for Kids for up to \$4,000. The coats are distributed to Head Start and to The Nest of Des Moines County.

Dream Catchers, \$2,000, will be awarded to the Des Moines Dream Catchers Program. These funds will be used to help those, of all ages, in Hospice; to fulfill their last wishes.

This is our 27th year of providing new coats for kids! The project provides new coats to needy children from newborn to 5 years old. We work with The Nest and Head Start to identify gender and size of coats needed. Coordination of the sizes needed is a challenge when it comes the purchasing of the coats. We try not to purchase all the same color and style for the same size. You want to avoid the identification that a group of kids all got the same coat from Kiwanis.

The goal has always been to fund this project completely. Kiwanis members always help with donations during a December meeting and you have been great to support the project over the years. Last year members donated \$836. Thank you for your support for this project.

This year we will be collecting on December 5.

Sarah Schwartz has been instrumental in seeking corporate donations for several years now. Last year she was able to get these donations from Great River Health for \$500 and the ShopKo Foundation for \$750.


