

Board of Directors Update

Your Directors and Officers approved the following funding requests at the July and August board meetings.

The Nurses Program, which allows school nurses to purchase items needed by students with no questions asked, for both months was \$245.85.

Burlington high School has a locker project that includes giving those in need water, food, paper, socks and other necessities. This project is very similar to the Nurses Program above and we donated \$1,000.

Burlington Pool Bubble is a one-time request for \$73,000. This donation is combined with a previous donation of \$2,000 and includes naming rights and the Burlington Kiwanis Club will be displayed on the pool bubble.

Bees Reading Club Project is a three year commitment for \$4,500. This was approved by the club on August 1st. Children will read books and are rewarded with Bees Baseball tickets, popcorn, treats, bounce house bands, and sandwiches. Also, some of the funds will go to support their Kids Day events. It is estimated to serve 5,000 children.

The Dictionary and Thesaurus Committee will receive up to \$1,500 to distribute 11 cases of books to local schools.
